Description: The Washington City Youth Council is an official youth organization council adopted by the City Council of Washington, Utah. The Washington City Youth Council will be established with the intent to provide the youth of Washington an opportunity to voice their opinion and share a role in the decision-making of our City Issues. Membership to the Washington City Youth Council is determined by application and interviews given by graduating peers. Members are governed by the bylaws ratified by the Washington City Council. Each member of the board shares in the responsibilities of the board.

Attendance: Attendance is mandatory. The Washington City Youth Council holds their bi-monthly meeting at the Covington home at 5:00 PM. By Invitation many of the members of the City Council, the Mayor or other members of Management will be in attendance to help discuss pertinent and timely information about the workings of the City. Each meeting is vital and the group works jointly with the mayor and council to address local current issues and brainstorm how to improve city conditions for the future generations and the present community. Participation in community service projects, speaking engagements, and various activities is expected.

Events: The Washington City Youth Council volunteers many hours of community service and organize their own events and service projects to promote their council and give back to the community, this is known as a “legacy project.” A major project of the Washington City Youth Council is the Washington Cotton Days. Other activities include: 4th of July, Hosting a haunted house with distribution of trick or treat bags, speaking engagements, tours of the Covington Home, Christmas in Dixie, and others yet to be determined. The participants will meet and discuss local issues with the Mayor and City Council Members and learn more about the city’s governmental structure, its budget and finances, public works, utility, and police and fire operations through interactive discussions with key city staff. They will also participate in a Mock City Council Meeting and follow Robert’s Rules of Order.
