Each meeting is vital and the group works jointly with the mayor and council to address local current issues and brainstorm how to improve city conditions for the future generations and the present community. Participation in community service projects, speaking engagements, and various activities is expected.

Events: The Washington City Youth Council volunteers many hours of community service and organize their own events and service projects to promote their council and give back to the community, this is known as a "legacy project." A major project of the Washington City Youth Council has been the organization and implementation of Washington Cotton Days.
